Jeremiah Daring to Hope in an Unstable World

The words of the prophet Jeremiah echo into our lives and culture with great relevance. This prophet found himself in a nation known for materialism, economic crises, political globalization, and religious plurality. Sounds familiar, doesn't it? Jeremiah's message from God to the people in their uncertain times was for them to dare to hope – to put their hope in God alone instead of political alliances, material possessions, and people. The underlying message of his writings is that hope-filled living is possible even in an unstable world. It's a message that speaks to us today as well.

Rather than going through the Book of Jeremiah chapter by chapter, we will explore six hope - inspiring themes that are found throughout the chapters. As we delve into Jeremiah's writings, we'll find God calling us to lay aside our worry, fear, doubt, and bitterness and, instead, dare to hope – not in government, our family, a job, or even the church, but in Him alone.

There are 3 levels of participation which you may choose.

2. Basic Study: Purchase a book and complete as much homework as you can in the month. This study is designed for 6 weeks but we only meet once a month so you have plenty of time to do the lessons.
3. Deeper Study: Memorize the memory verses (1-2 month); Read through the book of Jeremiah. You will be guided through the reading during the study. Read Digging deeper articles online that will give you additional insights and information on the topic.

We have women who are in each of these categories so it's up to you how much you want to put into the study. We find that all of us are learning together. We would love to have you join us.
